

Alsarah & The Nubatones (USA)

CHAPITEAU | Fri. 31 March | 20:30 | seated | 59.-

The Festival will start to the compelling « Nubian retropop » rhythms of singer and ethnomusicologist Alsarah, who will be bringing her album Manara, released at the end of 2016. At the cross roads of cultures and continents, this new album is a beacon of musical multiculturalism, singing the shared story of willing and forced migration, past and present. Accompanied by oud and East-African percussions, Alsarah reveals multiple influences ranging from Jamaican diva Grace Jones to famous Sudanese singer and composer Abdel Gadir Salim. Arabic, African and Afro-American influences join in the pentatonic explorations and subtly dissonant counterpoints of the Nubatones, transcending all geographic, linguistic and cultural barriers.

Amine & Hamza 7tet feat. Vincent Peirani (TUN/CH)

NEXT STEP | Tuesday 4 April | 19:30 | seated | 42.-

On one side there is, Amine & Hamza M'raihi, one on oud, the other on kanoun, expanded formation playing an enchanting music, a real invitation to travel. On the other side, accordion player and high-wire artist Vincent Peirani, multiple laureate including a Victoire du Jazz in 2014. He set the Next Step on fire last year with his electrifying project Living Being. And in the middle, Stakhanovist drummer Maxence Sibille, a regular at the Festival Ensemble, playing drums in an inventive and daring way. Together these very different musicians will play along to songs from Fertile Paradoxes, the Tunisians' eighth album released in March 2017. Always on the lookout for new sounds, their meditative and flowing music is punctuated by impromptu journeys and full of hypnotising exchanges.

Autour de Chet

CHAPITEAU | Sunday 2 April | 18:00 | seated | 68.-

Chet Baker, dusky trumpetist, melancholic singer, lost poet. Autour de Chet is the name of Clément Ducol's project in honour of the near mythical musician and his impertinent talent bordering on the myhtological. A masterfully delicate project, with artists hailing from the world of jazz, pop and folk, all fascinated by the trumpetist and bluesy crooner. They are some of the best French musicians of the moment. Cully will discover the trumpets of Erik Truffaz and Airelle Besson, alongside singers Camelia Jordana and not to mention British singer Hugh Coltman. They will be backed by pianist Bojan Z, bass player Christophe Minck, cellist Pierre-Francois Dufour and drummer Cyril Atef for their only concert in Switzerland.

Avishai Cohen's Jazz Free (ISR)

CHAPITEAU | Saturday 1 April | 20:30 | seated | 59.-

No need to introduce the jazz musician Avishai Cohen, double bass player but also composer, arranger and singer who inspired a new generation of outstanding Israeli musicians. A key artist on the American music scene at the beginning of the 21st century, he has since been drawn back to his Israeli origins. For his next stopover in Cully, this music genius has decided to be accompanied in the Chapiteau by his double bass and his bass in a novel project: Avishai Cohen's Jazz Free. Together with Yael Shapira on cello, Itamar Doari on the drums, Elyasaf Bishari on oud and bass guitar, Tal Kohavi on drums, and Yonatan Daskall on keyboards, Avishai Cohen will know how to push his music to the limits, and reach the point where jazz origins meet Israeli-Latino rhythms, classical music and middle eastern sounds.

Internationally acclaimed bass player Avishai Cohen is a regular at Cully. Guided by an unquenchable thirst for new musical experiences, the Israeli musician will grace Cully with two concerts. After the obligatory concert on the main stage of the Festival on Saturday with his new sextet, he will explore the acoustics of the Temple for the first time the next day. Exclusively for the festival, he will have a go at playing solo, with only a bass and a piano for company. This world premiere gives us a privileged and intimate peek into the bass player's musical universe. Get up close to his mind-boggling virtuosity, melodic genius and enchanting lyricism.

Do New York New York, My Way or Fly me to the moon ring a bell? Frank Sinatra of course! The crooner with the suave and languorous voice, the legendary American singer who recorded over a thousand songs and melted many a young girl's heart is coming back to life thanks to soul man Ben l'Oncle Soul's futurist tribute. This is a love story between Frank Sinatra's voice, discovered by the soul man whilst driving a beige Monte Carlo in Los Angeles, and this soul man. It went on to evolve in the Blue Note studios and resulted in the recording of the LP Under my Skin. Live on stage, the French singer makes covers of some of the greatest jazz standards in a feline soul that has undertones of pop, reggae and hip hop.

He made a name for himself alongside the best contemporary bluesmen and he is back with his 25th LP continuing his journey towards international recognition.

Moved by the spirit of the legendary bluesman Skip James, one of the emblematic figures of Delta Blues who passed away in 1969, the composer and writer Blick Bassy is on a quest for his musical origins in Akö, his most recent album overflowing with grace, a heartwarming tribute to the inventors of blues. Throughout a beautiful dialogue between the United States, France and Cameroun, in an intimate and refined style, this son of Yaoundé retraces the origins of his own journey through stories on childhood, traditions, wisdom and ancestors. A magical moment to be witnessed at the Next Step, sung in Bassa, one of the 260 languages spoken in Cameroun, somewhere between New Orleans swing, rhythm'n' blues and exhilarating melodies.

"Christian Scott is no typical jazz man. This phenomenal trumpet player is creating a new generation of jazz". Those are the words found in the New York Times describing the unique prodigy from New Orleans. He flirts with hip hop and soul and sometimes gets intimate with electro music. Christian Scott graduated from the prestigious Berklee College of Music and in just a few years has become the main man of a new generation of trumpet players who have given new dignity and high quality sounds to the instrument whilst challenging the rules of the genre. Their aim? Open up jazz to new horizons and to a new audience. Christian Scott's style is aesthetic and hybrid and he will have the Next Step shaking to his super trendy kaleidoscope groove with its many different influences.

A nomination for the Swiss music awards, a third album on the prestigious ECM label: the pianist from Yverdon and his exquisite trio have everything going for them. After several concerts at Cully - in the THBBC with Contreband and solo in the Temple -Colin Vallon will present his 5th album, Danse, under the Chapiteau. Structured by the solid harmonical framework of bass player Patrice Moret, visited by the delicate rhythmical musings of drummer Julian Sartorius, this album reveals a unique symbiosis between the three musicians. The Swiss trio's astonishing creative freedom and balance verging on perfection guarantees an unforgettable concert as first part of the legendary McCoy Tyner.

He is one of Europe's most groovy pianists, one of the jazz artists everyone wants to see, weaving his way skilfully between Afro-jazz, soul and funk. Following in the footsteps of the likes of Herbie Hancock and the Headhunters or Sly and The Family Stone, whilst adding hip-hop elements (Kendrick Lamar, Anderson Paak), Eric Legnini, seen last year at the Chapiteau with trumpet player Ibrahim Maalouf, will be playing at the Next Step alongside his ever-faithful accomplices, drummer Franck Agulhon and electric bass player Da Romeo. The trio will be accompanied on stage by trumpetist Quentin Ghomari, the Canadian Michelle Willis, voice and backing vocals, who grew up listening to Ray Charles and Carole King, and finally by gentleman singer Hugh Coltman and his spellbinding voice, who has now been touring with Legnini for five years.

Fink's Sunday Night Blues Club

Brighton born singer songwriter and performer **Fink**, whose real name is Fin Greenall, starts off playing electro hip hop but very quickly gets bored of his career as a DJ and decides to be a blues and jazz songwriter. There is something very mysterious in his music, a soft melancholy and an intense and transcendent musicality. Today as well as being a world acclaimed performer, Fink has worked alongside artists like Bonobo, Amy Winehouse, Professor Green and John Legend as a songwriter and composer.

He will start his new project **Fink's Sunday Night Blues Club** in Cully before an exclusive European tour.

ECHOS SPIRITUELS – Creation of François Lindemann.

After gaining international recognition with Piano Seven, the Swiss pianist will return to the Festival by investing the Temple as a place of musical and spiritual explorations. To celebrate the occasion, the Lausannebred musician has invited virtuoso double bass player and 2016 winner of the Suisa prise for Jazz, Heiri Känzig. These "Spiritual echos" would not be complete without the major sensation of French Jazz, saxophone player Guillaume Perret. This won't be his first time in Cully, as he rocked the festival with *Electric Epic's* progressive 2015. pulsations back in Francois Lindemann has prepared an exclusive project with two giants of European jazz for his come-back to Cully.

HEMU Jazz Orchestra / Ravel – Big Valses (CH)

CHAPITEAU | Saturday 1 April | 20:30 | seated | 59.-

Α transcription of Valses Nobles et Sentimentales for Big Band by Pierre Drevet. In 1911, the composer Maurice Ravel composes in Paris the last phrase of his Valses Nobles et Sentimentales for piano. In 2015 in Bruges, the Brussels Jazz Orchestra in collaboration with the Filharmonie, the Royal Flemish Philharmonic, go on stage for the first representation of the Big Valses !. Though it is inspired by Ravel, this version has been worked on and revisited through jazz music by Pierre Drevet, arranger, trumpet player and a member of the prestigious Belgian big band for a dozen of years. In 2016 in Cully, the students of the classical and jazz branch of the Haute école de musique de Lausanne (HEMU) take on the stage for a unique performance of the recomposed Valses Nobles et Sentimentales. This performance on the stage of the Chapiteau marks the second collaboration between the school and the Festival.

Henri Texier Sky Dancers 6 (FR)

CHAPITEAU | Wed. 5 April | 20:30 | seated | 59.-

Emblematic figure of European Jazz, the double bass player will tread the stage of the Chapiteau for the first time with his Sky Dancers sextet. From Comanche to Navajo Dream, Henri Texier delivers on his latest album a powerful tribute to Native American culture, already celebrated on An Indian's week in 1993. The musician's thirst for experimenting has led him across the globe from a very young age, in a quest for new musical perpetual explorations. Collaborating at first with the greatest names of American Jazz, such as Dexter Gordon, Lee Konitz and Don Cherry, he then made a name for himself, bringing out over 20 albums. Discoverer of new talents and catalyst of trends, Henri Texier leads his latest sextet with burning passion, confronting different generations of musicians and uniting creative energies with a master's touch.

John Medeski solo (USA)

TEMPLE | Thursday 6 April | 21:00 | seated | 42.-

You can't mention the word Hammond without also mentioning John Medeski. After appearing many times as a trio at the Chapiteau this shamanic keyboard player abandons his companions Billy Martin and Chris Wood for a solo and unique journey at the Temple. John Medeski is therefore not unknown to the solo world as he produced in 2013 A Different Time on Okeh. This track comes as a surprise, revealing a completely new side to the pianist's artistic personality: far from the electric characteristics of his legendary trio, he reveals sparkling grace with impressionist overtones. Accompanied by his Hammond organ, John Medeski will be experimenting with the acoustics of the Temple of Cully for the very first time. The experience is something like a return to his roots for this musician as he revisits his favourite instrument - originally used to accompany gospels in churches - in a place of worship.

Expertly blending West-African music, blues and jazz, Kala Jula offers a daring interpretation of the Manding tradition with a modern twist. Created in 2011 the duo brings together Vincent Zanetti, Swiss multiinstrumentalist and composer, and Samba Diabaté, one of the most respected guitar players in Bamako. Surrounded by a multitude of instruments from around the globe - including the unmissable kora and balafon - the two musicians engage in a meaningful musical dialogue, paying their respects to the adoptive land of one and homeland of the other. The Manding spirit will take possession of the Temple's acoustics and will invite the audience on an African pilgrimage to (re)discover the nomadic Malian culture.

Get ready for an astonishing encounter between two different generations and musical cultures. He will play alongside Gregory Privat, young pianist from Martinique and rising star of the new French generation. Together they will revisit Danielsson's album Liberetto 2, released in 2014 on the Act label, which featured pianist Tigran Hamasyan and Magnus Öström, orphan drummer of E.S.T. The young pianist will bring his innovative style to Danielsson's lyricism, making for an electrifying evening laden with mystical moments.

This lively singer and cello player binds together in an agile and unique way her Creole and Canadian roots. Her delicate, simple and masterful creations plunge us into the Louisiana bayou and the folklore of her Haitian childhood. Before going solo, Leyla McCalla used to travel the highways of the USA with the popular "oldtime string band" Carolina Chocolate Drop. She settled in New Orleans after hearing a distant call from the South, where she is passionately involved with the heritage music of the town and her cosmopolitan spirit. Her first LP Vari-Colored Songs placed her firmly in the spotlight, and she has since released A day for the hunter, a day for the prey in 2016, where French, English and Creole traditional songs are mixed with her own outstanding compositions.

Without the instruments of choice for this musical genre (voice, violin, guitar and piano), the Quarteto Gardel break all stereotypes and present here a pure and stripped down tango with unique panache. Overseen by the accordion player Lionel Suarez, the quartet bring together French cello player Vincent Segal, Argentinian percussionist Minino Garay - two regulars at Cully Jazz -, as well as the trumpet player, composer and conductor Airelle Besson, a leading figure on the contemporary French music scene. Together, these exceptional artists pay tribute to the master of Argentinian tango's spellbinding work.

He is one of the greatest pianists in jazz history: exuberant, unique, four time Grammy Awards winner, McCoy Tyner has influenced many musicians, past and present. In 1972 he recorded the piano solo Echoes of a Friend, a tribute to his close friend John Coltrane, alongside whom he refined his piano skills in the 60s. McCoy Tyner will revisit his songs, surrounded by two other amazing keyboard players, Geri Allen 19 years his junior, who appeared as lead with Paul Motian, Charlie Haden and in Steve Coleman's group Five Elements. And with Craig Taborn, who is considered to be one of the most demanding musicians of New York's avant-gardist music scene. This evening is guaranteed to be exceptional with these three generations of pianists.

The Cully Jazz Festival presents the amazing collaboration between a Serbian accordionist and a Turkish saz player, kind of a lute with a long neck. Somewhere between classical music, folk and jazz, Taylan Arikan and Srdjan Vukasinovic push back the limits of their instruments. With Roberto Hacaturyan on drums, they bring authenticity and innovation to each of their compositions. In the same spirit, the accordionist is notable for his unique instrument, divided into twenty-four quarter tones- specially adapted for the needs of the duo and their oriental vibe. They will be joined for the evening by Carles Benavent revolutionary pioneer of contemporary flamenco and mythical bass player for Chick Corea, Paco de Lucia and Miles Davis.

Born in Los Angeles the phenomenal Miles Mosley is a true double bass maestro. He is the producer and founding member of The West Coast Get Down collective and has produced, toured, performed and recorded with artists like Lauryn Hill, Cee Lo Green, Jeff Beck, Mos Def and Chris Cornell. He has also featured on three tracks of Kendrick Lamar's outstanding LP To Pimp a Butterlfy and on saxophonist Kamasi Washington's latest monumental LP The Epic. Considered as one of the best double bassist in the world the "Jimi Hendrix of the double bass" will be performing his forthcoming album Uprising in front of the audience at the Next Step. 1975, Addis Abeba. The heart of the Ethiopian capital lives to the beats of ethio-jazz, a real musical revolution with Mulatu Astatke at its head. After training in the greatest music schools of Great-Britain and the States- the vibraphone player was the first student of African origin to sit on the benches of the New England Conservatory- he returned to his homeland with his suitcases full of new ideas and a brave vision that will change the face of Ethiopian music forever. Mixing traditional music and jazz, the musician introduced western instruments (vibraphone, saxophone, trumpets, electric instruments, etc.) to his country. Since his debut on DJ Jazzy Jeff's album The Magnificent, discrete Oddisee has released over ten albums, including the recent The Odd Tape, a fragmentary tale of his life in New York, an instrumental trip to the confines of jazz hip-hop, soul and abstract. Recognised for his collaborations with artists such as Talib Kweli, J-Live and DJ Jazzy Jeff, the MC/beatmaker – who grew up in Washington but spent his childhood summers in Karthoum learning Arabic and swimming in the Nile - produces an introspective hip-hop tinged with jazz, soul and funk. He will be bringing his band The Good Compny and guitarist and singer Olivier St. Louis to Cully for an unforgettable show.

He will take the Next Step on a musical trip to a hybrid and unique universe where soul, hip-hop and jazz meet the urban sounds of the vibrant London music scene.

Paolo Fresu Quintet (ITA)

2014 saw the release of , 30! : an anniversary album and ode to friendship and melody by Sardinian trumpetist Paolo Fresu's historic quintet, famous well beyond the limits of the Bel Paese, and a known figure of the Festival. The Italian group, who brought out five albums for Blue Note on their 20th anniversary, will invite the Chapiteau into the musical worlds of each of the group members: the thirteen original pieces that compose 30! vary between delicate introspection and rhythmical "arrogance", polyrhythmy and African rhythms. But it is above all through their melodic ballads, reminiscent of the musical landscapes crafted by Miles Davis at the time of his second quintet, that shines the talent of Fresu's phrasing, the elegance of Tino Tracanna's saxophone, the complicity between Fioravanti's drums and Zanchi's bass, Roberto Cipelli's subtle piano. Fascinating, sophisticated and sublime jazz.

Right from his beginnings in New York in the 90s the crowds were seduced by his bass playing and his unique presence. This story surprising musician teller and with enchanting vocals has been renamed the African Sting. He will be at the Chapiteau with his Afro-Cuban group Mandekan Cubano who wisely fusion together African, South American and Cuban sonorities. On stage Richard Bona and his musicians will be reliving Buena Vista Social Club and Irakere's heritage by exploring new horizons, walking off-piste to discover and create an astonishing universe where African and Cuban clave are one. Here Cuban rhythms dance swiftly alongside melancholic ballads. Their message? To make music a universal language.

Seun Kuti & Egypt 80 (NGA)

Oluseun Anikulapo Kuti, aka Seun Kuti, is the youngest son of the legendary father of Afro beat Fela Kuti. By the age of eight he started learning the saxophone and the piano and by the age of nine he was a backing vocalist in his dad's orchestra Egypt 80. Seun was fifteen in 1997 when his father Fela died, but he decided to take up the role his father had and he put himself in charge of the orchestra. From then on he toured the international music scene with Egypt 80's 15 musicians and transformed the musical and political heritage of Black President by adding his own touch, including different styles such as soul, rap, calypso and funk. He's got the lot: the movement, the phrasing, the brass composition, the hypnotic percussions and the powerful voices. As talented and charismatic as his father, Seun Kuti will make the Chapiteau tremble to the sound of his high voltage Afro beat with its vibrant funk energy.

Tigran Hamasyan – An ancient Observer (ARM)

From a very young age, the gifted child of "Armenian Jazz" has captivated the crowds and amassed awards from many prestigious competitions such as those organised by the Montreux Jazz and the Thelonius Monk Institute. Virtuoso pianist and exceptional composer, Tigran Hamasyan has been in the international spotlight for the past ten years. The ingredients of his talent: touching lyricism with an impressive mastery and a precise yet sophisticated rhythmically inspired by his oriental origins. After a four year break from the Festival, the pianist will celebrate his return in the sacred halls of the Festival. He will bring with him his latest and second solo album, An Ancient Observer, set to be released in March 2017. A perfect blend of ancient melodies and contemporary inspirations, the musician reveals his latest authentic and invaluable treasures.

The "sorcerer of Lagos" has imagined a dialogue with his American homologue, founder of the Jazz Messengers and inventor of hard bop.

Presentation of the OFF Festival

Jazz diversity in the heart of Cully

The OFF Festival is one of the main highlights of the Cully Jazz Festival. It offers around 90 free concerts throughout the nine days of the festival, in twelve locations scattered around the town. Since 2016, one of the stages has been dedicated to European Jazz.

The constantly evolving OFF Festival is meeting with growing success. It is based in a few wine cellars, numbers varying between 12 and 14 depending on the year, and presents each year a large variety of up and coming jazz artists as well as roots. The excellent quality of the programme has made the frontiers between the IN and OFF Festival less and less obvious, as the "residencies" and the Club, inaugurated in 2016, have clearly demonstrated.

Huge success for the residencies

The **residency** formula is the highlight of some locations of the OFF Festival and has created some unique artistic meetings, unforgettable not only for the audience but also for the artists. As epitomised by the jam sessions at the **Caveau des Vignerons**, a place of wild ambiances, musical exchanges and exploration, where some artists from the IN Festival continue their night after their "official" concerts. Home to the Matthieu Llodra Trio since 2013, this temple of improvised music typifies the essence of the Cully Jazz Festival.

For more than 10 years, the **THBBC** has excelled in launching audacious projects. This wine cellar is home to outstanding creativity and whilst the performing space is not big, it hosted The Treichler Pizzi Trontin Experience (better known as The Young Gods) in 2015 offering the audience an intimate moment and a unique concert with this legendary group. For the 35th edition of the Festival the wine cellar will be welcoming Swiss musician and singer Simon Gerber for five evenings. The new residency at the **Caveau du Raisin** is the result of a collaboration between the Auberge du Raisin and the THBBC. On stage a trio of musicians who are frequent festival goers will let you discover their original project called *For A Word* based on text. The musicians performing this unique project are Gauthier Toux on piano, Valentin Liechti on drums and Julien Herné on bass.

The town of Cully is abuzz with jazz

Acting as a barometer of Swiss jazz, the **Schlagzeug** and the **Sweet Basile** attract lovers of contemporary jazz who are curious to discover the young new talented artists of an explosive music scene that has lived up to its promises. The **Caveau Mélanie Weber** on the other hand offers a wide variety of genres and an open window on the world.

Traditional jazz lovers won't be disappointed either as they meet up at the **Caveau Potterat** and at the **Biniou** to listen to music from New Orleans, at the **Café de Ia Poste** for some blues and in the cale of the boat **Boat Club Venoge** for some travel inspiring jazz. This year the Venoge will be welcoming the first ever edition of a Gypsy jam of the Festival, bringing together the young generation of gypsy swing under the watchful eye of violinist Baiju Bhatt.

Spotlight on European jazz

The OFF Festival reinvents itself each year. In 2016 the dream was to have a stage only for newly discovered European jazz. And that, as they say, is now history! The **Club** (formerly old Jardin) welcomes promising young artists, recently graduated form the best jazz music schools, and is one of the only dedicated stages for the next generation of European jazz in a festival.

The Festival's portrait

Synopsis...

The 35th annual Cully Jazz Festival will take place from March 31 to April 8, 2017. Offering 9 days of music, approximately 35 ticketed concerts and 90 free concerts, the Cully Jazz Festival has become a not-tobe-missed event for connaisseurs of jazz and ambience. In 2016, over 55,000 people walked through the narrow streets, wine cellars and along the lakefront in Cully.

The Cully Jazz Festival has stayed true to the values which have contributed to its success for 35 years: the quality of its musical programme, the committed volunteers, and the loyal audience. All are enhanced by the beautiful setting and the warm hospitality of the locals.

Jazz in all its forms

Every year, the village of Cully celebrates Jazz with prestigious, crowd-pleasing concerts. At the same time, curious festivalgoers wishing to enjoy the unique atmosphere of the place can wander freely between a myriad of wine cellars, constituting the OFF Festival. It is, without a doubt, the blend of the IN Festival's ticketed concerts and the OFF Festival's free concerts that attract more visitors every year.

On its three stages – Chapiteau, Next Step and Temple – the **IN Festival** can pride itself on having welcomed prestigious artists such as Bobby McFerrin, Wayne Shorter, Gilberto Gil, Madeleine Peyroux, Marianne Faithfull, Dee Dee Bridgewater, Charles Lloyd, Jan Garbarek, Carla Bley, Marcus Miller, Michel Petrucciani, John Scofield, Ahmad Jamal, Monty Alexander, Gregory Porter and Lisa Simone.

The **OFF Festival** consists of twelve cafés and wine cellars spread throughout the village. It provides a springboard for many young Swiss Jazz players; artists playing in the OFF Festival often find themselves on the line-up for the IN Festival a couple of



years later. However, sometimes the opposite happens, and an artist having played for the IN decides to come back to Cully for a residency during the OFF.

A Festival in the heart of the Lavaux

Located on the shores of Lake Geneva, in the heart of the Lavaux World Heritage site, Cully is a wine-growing village of exceptional charm. For more than 30 years, its inhabitants have been opening their doors, their cellars, and even sometimes their living rooms to musicians, allowing an unequal feeling of sharing and conviviality. Thus, lovers of quality music, elegant wines and good company gather in a lively Festival thanks to the generosity of Cully's inhabitants.

The Festival could not take place without the help of their volunteer staff. Even though the operational management of the Festival is the responsibility of a team of professionals, ranging from 2 to 9 as the year progresses. The Organizing Committee consists of 9 members, all volunteers. Their work is further supported over the 9 days of the Festival by 500 volunteers who work in various sectors.





She only works with precious metals such as silver, gold, platinum and palladium. She sometimes adds precious stones to her jewels. All of her creations are hand crafted.
